Consultation on Proposed UK Immigration and Settlement Pathways:

The government has launched a consultation, "[A Fairer Pathway to Settlement: statement and accompanying consultation on earned settlement](#)" inviting public views to help shape the proposed changes to UK immigration. The consultation closes on **12th February at 23:59**. Before [completing the form](#), respondents should read and understand the changes.

The consultation follows a May 2025 white paper, "[Restoring Control over the Immigration System](#)," which set out major reforms to reduce net migration. Some changes have already been implemented: since July 2025, the skills threshold for Skilled Worker visas increased to graduate level, the Social Care Worker visa route closed to new overseas applicants, and the Immigration Skills Charge rose by 32%. Since 8 January, English language requirements have increased to B2 level for Skilled Worker, Scale-up, and High Potential Individual applicants.

The most significant proposed change is that the current five-year route to Indefinite Leave to Remain would be replaced with a baseline ten-year qualifying period. This period could be reduced based on contributions such as high earnings, public service or volunteering. These changes would apply retrospectively to people already in the UK who are currently on a pathway to settlement, though those already granted settled status will retain it.

Particularly relevant to the VCSE is the opportunity to reduce the qualifying period by volunteering, what do you think of this? Have your say before the consultation closes!

New Family Hub in Bradford City Centre

The Bevan Family Hub has opened in Bradford centre, providing support services for children and families. The hub, located at the [Bevan Community Benefit Society](#), launched on 16th January 2026. This is a partnership between Bradford Children and Families Trust, Bradford Council, and Bevan.

Bradford Council's [Family Hub Start for Life programme](#) funded renovations to make the space more accessible and family-friendly, with accessible ramps, a sensory room, baby changing facilities, and updated interiors. The hub offers free sessions including play groups, reading activities, baby massage, infant feeding support, health clinics, and sessions with family navigators who provide guidance on parenting and local family resources. These complement existing programmes already offered at Bevan.

Voluntary Sector Area Networks:

These investments help people unlock their full potential and achieve their aspirations, regardless of their abilities, ethnicity, gender, or sexuality. Applications are currently being accepted for grants of up to £50,000 until 30th April through the [BRIT Trust website](#). To be eligible, applicant organisations must be a registered charity delivering music-focused activities aimed at individuals aged 16 and above. An Open Call for Membership of a new West Yorkshire VCSE Advisory Group:

The Voluntary, Community and Social Enterprise (VCSE) sector plays a vital role in ensuring that the benefits of devolution reach all our people and communities.

That's why West Yorkshire's Combined Authority, Local Authorities, and place-based Local Infrastructure Organisations are working in partnership to establish a new VCSE Advisory Group. This group will act as advocates, champions, and ambassadors for this important and valued sector.

What will the group do? The Advisory Group will serve as the VCSE sector's strategic point of contact with the Mayor of West Yorkshire, Tracy Brabin, and the West Yorkshire Combined Authority.

They are looking for dynamic and forward-thinking local VCSE leaders to join the group and work alongside senior representatives from the region's five Local Infrastructure Organisations. Membership is voluntary, but support will be available, including mentoring and training for early-stage leaders with outstanding potential. Co-Design Bradford District's Digital Inclusion Network:

Over the past few years, significant progress has been made in improving digital inclusion across communities through collaborative projects, working groups, and on-the-ground support. The commitment and insight of partners have been central to this progress.

Bradford is taking action. Bradford City Council has commissioned [Chapter One](#), a charity specialising in gambling harm prevention, to deliver a comprehensive training programme for professionals who may encounter adults at risk of or experiencing gambling harm. The free 2-hour online session is designed for frontline professionals, support workers, advice services, healthcare professionals, community organisers and recovery support workers.

Health and Care System News

Digital and AI in Delivering Neighbourhood Health.

[Health Innovation Yorkshire & Humber](#) is hosting a virtual event examining how digital technology and AI can help support the [Government's Ten Year Health Plan](#) by enabling more integrated, preventative, and person-centred care.

Open to all but specifically designed for NHS, public and voluntary sector staff, this session explores how digital and AI solutions can strengthen neighbourhood health services, enabling teams to work more collaboratively and effectively, deliver care closer to home, and better serve the diverse needs of local communities. The programme features a national update on the neighbourhood health programme from Dr Minal Bakhai (Primary Care and Community Transformation), regional perspectives from the North East and Yorkshire from Tracy Wright (Regional Portfolio Lead, Community Health Services) and Professor Arunangsu Chatterjee (West Yorkshire ICB).

30-Minute Stop Smoking Training.

Bradford Metropolitan District Council's Public Health team is offering free [VBA+ \(Very Brief Advice\) stop smoking training](#) for anyone working in health, social care, or support roles in the Bradford District. Helping someone quit smoking is a life-saving intervention. VBA+ promotes quitting and can be delivered in under 30 seconds in almost any situation. [NICE](#) recommends that all health and social care professionals be trained in VBA. The [e-learning session](#) is available online at any time.

Food Support for Pregnant Women & Children under 4:

The [NHS Healthy Start scheme](#) supports families on low incomes to access healthy foods, milk, and vitamins. If you're more than 10 weeks pregnant or have children under 4 years old and receive certain benefits, you may be eligible.
